

As per your request of June 12th concerning the charity information for the Texas Racing Commission, enclosed is a copy of our I.R.S. letter of determination (1996) which qualifies Race Track Chaplaincy of Texas as an exempt organization for federal income tax purposes.

According to our Articles of Incorporation, RTCT was organized for religious and educational purposes through placing an ordained minister at each racetrack in the state of Texas. Activities include (a) providing counseling for those with such problems as absenteeism, troublesome behavior, emotional and mental illness, marital and financial difficulties; (b) providing emotional support and encouragement to individuals struggling to overcome dependencies to alcohol or drugs; (c) influencing people to respect the property of others, thereby reducing crime; (d) comforting in times of stress, illness, hospital stays and bereavement; (e) helping people to better understand themselves and others; (f) promoting "golden rule" attitudes for mutual helpfulness, trustworthiness and dependability; (g) projecting a favorable image for the industry by establishing community relationships; (h) demonstrating the industry's concern for the social, educational, spiritual and physical well-being of its employees; (i) supporting values encouraged by the racing industry such as integrity, loyalty and honesty; (j) officiating at weddings, funerals and other occasions.

Dear Applicant:

Based on information you supplied, and assuming your operations will be as stated in your application for recognition of exemption, we have determined you are exempt from federal income tax under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in section 501(c)(3).

Because you are a newly created organization, we are not now making a final determination of your foundation status under section 509(a) of the Code. However, we have determined that you can reasonably expect to be a publicly supported organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

Accordingly, during an advance ruling period you will be treated as a publicly supported organization, and not as a private foundation. This advance ruling period begins and ends on the dates shown above.

Within 90 days after the end of your advance ruling period, you must send us the information needed to determine whether you have met the requirements of the applicable support test during the advance ruling period. If you establish that you have been a publicly supported organization, we will classify you as a section 509(a)(1) or 509(a)(2) organization as long as you continue to meet the requirements of the applicable support test. If you do not meet the public support requirements during the advance ruling period, we will classify you as a private foundation for future periods. Also, if we classify you as a private foundation, we will treat you as a private foundation from your beginning date for purposes of section 507(d) and 4940.

Grantors and contributors may rely on our determination that you are not a private foundation until 90 days after the end of your advance ruling period. If you send us the required information within the 90 days, grantors and contributors may continue to rely on the advance determination until we make a final determination of your foundation status.

If we publish a notice in the Internal Revenue Bulletin stating that we

will no longer treat you as a publicly supported organization, grantors and contributors may not rely on this determination after the date we publish the notice. In addition, if you lose your status as a publicly supported organization, and a grantor or contributor was responsible for, or was aware of, the act or failure to act, that resulted in your loss of such status, that person may not rely on this determination from the date of the act or failure to act. Also, if a grantor or contributor learned that we had given notice that you would be removed from classification as a publicly supported organization, then that person may not rely on this determination as of the date he or she acquired such knowledge.

If you change your sources of support, your purposes, character, or method of operation, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on your exempt status and foundation status. If you amend your organizational document or bylaws, please send us a copy of the amended document or bylaws. Also, let us know all changes in your name or address.

As of January 1, 1984, you are liable for social security taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act on amounts of \$100 or more you pay to each of your employees during a calendar year. You are not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the private foundation excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code. However, you are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other federal taxes, please let us know.

Donors may deduct contributions to you as provided in section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to you or for your use are deductible for Federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Donors may deduct contributions to you only to the extent that their contributions are gifts, with no consideration received. Ticket purchases and similar payments in conjunction with fundraising events may not necessarily qualify as deductible contributions, depending on the circumstances. Revenue Ruling 67-246, published in Cumulative Bulletin 1967-2, on page 104, gives guidelines regarding when taxpayers may deduct payments for admission to, or other participation in, fundraising activities for charity.

You are not required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax, if your gross receipts each year are normally \$25,000 or less. If you receive a Form 990 package in the mail, simply attach the label provided, check the box in the heading to indicate that your annual gross receipts are normally \$25,000 or less, and sign the return.

If you are required to file a return you must file it by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your annual accounting period. We charge a penalty of \$10 a day when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable

cause for the delay. However, the maximum penalty we charge cannot exceed \$5,000 or 5 percent of your gross receipts for the year, whichever is less. We may also charge this penalty if a return is not complete. So, please be sure your return is complete before you file it.

You are not required to file federal income tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an income tax return on Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter we are not determining whether any of your present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

You need an employer identification number even if you have no employees. If an employer identification number was not entered on your application, we will assign a number to you and advise you of it. Please use that number on all returns you file and in all correspondence with the Internal Revenue Service.

This determination is based on evidence that your funds are dedicated to the purposes listed in section 501(c)(3) of the Code. To assure your continued exemption, you should keep records to show that funds are spent only for those purposes. If you distribute funds to other organizations, your records should show whether they are exempt under section 501(c)(3). In cases where the recipient organization is not exempt under section 501(c)(3), you must have evidence that the funds will remain dedicated to the required purposes and that the recipient will use the funds for those purposes.

Since you have not indicated that you intend to finance your activities with the proceeds of tax exempt bond financing, in this letter, we have not determined the effect of such financing on your tax exempt status.

If we said in the heading of this letter that an addendum applies, the addendum enclosed is an integral part of this letter.


Because this letter could help us resolve any questions about your exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it in your permanent records.



GPISD Education Foundation

Background

The establishment of the Grand Prairie Education Foundation is the result of the realization of the need for much greater community involvement in our education process. It began in the Grand Prairie Chamber of Commerce Education Committee in the fall of 1995. While the concept began as Adopt-A-School, further research and discussions showed that this concept was too limited. The ability to raise funds, apply for grants, establish an endowment fund and partner with a multitude of outside organizations would best be accomplished with an education foundation.





You are not required to file Federal income tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an income tax return on Form 990-T. In this letter we are not determining whether any of your present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

You need an employer identification number even if you have no employees. If an employer identification number was not entered on your application, a number will be assigned to you and you will be advised of it. Please use that number on all returns you file and in all correspondence with the Internal Revenue Service.



On behalf of Sam Houston Race Park, I respectfully request to amend our Race Date Calendar for the upcoming Thoroughbred Meeting scheduled to begin on Friday, November 27.

Our proposal eliminates the following three days of racing in 2009:

- Sunday, November 29
- Saturday, December 26
- Sunday, December 27

These changes when combined with our requested dates for 2010 will give Sam Houston Race Park a 60-day Winter Thoroughbred Meet in 2009-10.

Furthermore, by making this change, Sam Houston Race Park will reduce race dates during a period when the horse population is already stressed by the overlap with Remington Park. 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



Gentlemen:

Please be advised that the Commission would like to take place on the agenda of the Tuesday, August 18, 2009, Commission Meeting the allocation of funds for Texas Bred Incentive Programs for calendar year 2009 for the following racetracks:

- Valle De Los Tesoros,
- Laredo Downs, and
- Laredo Race Park.

Under subsection 321.505(b), the Commission determines the division of Texas Bred Incentive Program funds after providing an opportunity for each official horse breed registry to present written information addressing the criteria listed in paragraph 321.505(b)(2). Alternatively, the Commission may approve an agreement that is signed by all of the official breed registries and that sets out the percentages by which these funds are to be divided among the various breeds of horses.

Staff is requesting that the breed registries meet and negotiate an agreement, in accordance with 321.505(b)(4), to be submitted to the Commission for consideration an approval for the above mentioned racetracks. The Commission has collected \$72,616 from Valle De Los Tesoros and \$56,928 from Laredo Downs in security that is attributed to Texas Bred Incentive Program funds. Staff would like to pay these funds to the breed registries, but needs an approved allocation division to be able accomplish this task. Although staff has collected no security from Laredo Race Park at this time it is possible that this could happen during calendar year 2009. If this were to happen, staff would need an approved allocation division to distribute these funds as well.

As there is no rush on the Commissions part to pay these funds at this time, we can postpone this agenda item until the breed registries have reached an agreement in accordance with 321.505(b)(4). To be placed on the August 18, 2009, Commission agenda, the signed agreements would need to be filed in the Austin office by 5:00 p.m., Monday, August 3, 2009.

To assist you with your discussions, I have included a copy of Texas Racing Commission Rule 321.505 and Texas Bred Funds Distributions Reports for both racetracks that the Commission has collected funds from. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at 512-833-6699.
