The grantee will be accountable for documenting the use of funds from the Horse Industry Escrow Account (HIEA) and must ensure that funds are used solely for authorized purposes. The grantee must ensure:

- Funds are used only for activities covered by the approved project.
- Funds are not used in violation of the restrictions and prohibitions of applicable rules and statutes.
- All reports are completed in a timely manner.

Each grantee must ensure it has an adequate accounting system in place and sufficient internal controls to ensure expenditures are reported and records maintained for five (5) years after the conclusion of the project, or longer if required by TXRC.

BUDGET INFORMATION

1. Advanced Funding Payments: This program may advance an amount in working capital for the grantee to ensure the necessary resources to carry out the project. These funds will require reporting to substantiate the advanced funds have been expended in compliance with eligibility requirements. Ineligible expenses must be personally reimbursed within 30 days of notice of ineligibility from TXRC. i. fundraising.

EVALUATION AND SELECTION INFORMATION

After all proposals have been received, TXRC program staff will conduct an administrative review to determine whether an application complies with all requirements of Tex. Occ. Code Section 2028.204(b) and 16 TAC Chapter 303, Subchapter G, and to evaluate the relevance and effectiveness of the proposed project based on the following factors:

- Anticipated impact on the state's horse racing industry
- Anticipated impact on live racing at the state's racetracks
- Anticipated impact on the horse breeding industry
- Anticipated impact on the state of Texas
- Anticipated impact on non-racing horse industry activities

Assessments of anticipated economic impact for an existing event must be based on only the effect of the additional funding provided from the Account. For example, if funds are requested from the Account for race award supplements for an existing horseracing event, the evaluation of the economic impact must be based only on the effect of the increased race awards, not on the economic impact of the entire race.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Grantees will be required to submit periodic performance reports. Reporting timelines will be incorporated into the funding agreement. As part of TXRC's ongoing monitoring of the use of funds from the Account, grantees must demonstrate progress toward achieving project goals. Failure to comply with reporting requirements may result in the withholding of further payments and/or termination of the award.

The Classic Horse Show is produced by Texas Quarter Horse Association (TQHA) and is held in Fort Worth. Classic Cash (exhibitor payouts) was implemented in 2022 with the new The Classic horse show and was a major success. Classic Cash payouts from the HIEA funding in 2022 were critical to the show's ability to attract exhibitors showing more than 300 horses and grow its entry and stall fees by more than 50%. As it becomes a financially viable event, The Classic will be better positioned to attract more involvement in the Texas horse industry.

Project Description

With funding from HIEA in 2023, Classic Cash will provide payouts to members of TQHA placing in the top seven in 140 performance classes with most of the payouts going to youth, novice and amateur exhibitors and will also include payouts in designated classes/specialty areas and Texas Foaled horses.

The Classic Cash focus of paying out deeper into classes will continue and will encourage more participation in The Classic. This will be the only event in Texas that pays out exhibitors through 7th place and has created interest and excitement in those horse owners who often do not place in the top few. To focus on Texas horse industry, the Top All Around Texas Foaled horse in each of 6 divisions will receive a Classic Cash payout. Other payouts to increase participation will include Ranch Classes, Hunter/Jumper Classes and various Special Stakes Classes for Novice or Green Horses.

Additionally, youth exhibitors that are high school seniors will be eligible for a Classic Cash Scholarship payout to further encourage youth participation in the equine industry.

These awards encourage Texas horse owners and riders to stay in Texas and out of state owners to travel to Texas to participate in The Classic. All payout winners must be TQHA or TQHYA members. As noted previously, the objective is to attract more exhibitors so advertising and other promotional materials will focus on these payout opportunities.

The impact of this award program will be increased participation in The Classic, giving our Texas Foaled horses and their owners/riders an opportunity to earn AQHA points and a cash award. In addition, there will be nationwide appeal to Texas Foaled horse owners to come to Texas and spend their dollars in Texas. Each horse competing has a support group of a minimum of three people, including trainers and family members.

Many equine associations have taken an active role in promoting and encouraging novice riders and recognize the long-term benefits of supporting new participants in their early experiences. The more that equine associations can continue to foster and encourage participation of these beginners, the greater chance of these individuals going on to increase their annual dollars spent on breeding and showing.
